





KEY MESSAGING – NEW PROCUREMENT POLICIES

- ➤ Government procurement has a **powerful role in shaping South Australia's economy**, business opportunities and the labour market.
- ➤ Public authorities will <u>analyse the supply market</u> to inform the development of an acquisition strategy.
- ➤ In addition to value for money consideration public authorities will consider the **economic benefit of the procurement to South Australian economy** in line with the SAIPP and SAIPP Procedural Guidelines.
- ➤ Where there is a South Australian business that could supply the required good or service but the recommended supplier is not a South Australian business, approval must be obtained from the public authority's Chief Executive.

NEW DEFINITION OF A SOUTH AUSTRALIAN BUSINESS

- A business is a South Australian business in relation to a procurement if the business operates in South Australia and more than

50% of the workforce delivering the contract resulting from the procurement on behalf of the business are **residents of South Australia**.



REVISED SAIPP & GUIDELINES

Minimum Requirements for Industry Participation

4.2. Professional Services: Project Managers, Architects, Designers, Engineers, Surveyors and Planners

PAs will procure local project managers, architects, designers, engineers, surveyors and planners from South Australian businesses for government projects above \$55,000. An Industry Advocate Sourcing and Outcome checklist must be completed, and a copy provided to the Industry Advocate. The Industry Advocate will review and monitor compliance and report on progress.

SA ABORIGINAL ECONOMIC PARTICIPATION

As of January 1st 2023 Responsible Govt Agencies can directly engage an eligible SA Aboriginal Business up to \$550K.

In 2016, the Aboriginal Economic Participation Policy was embedded in the South Australian Industry Participation Policy (SAIPP) to ensure it became part of mainstream procurement policy in the State.

The Aboriginal economic participation elements of the SAIPP aim to increase the level of South Australian Aboriginal business engagement and participation through **employment and economic opportunities** arising out of State Government expenditure.

- Ensures that only appropriately skilled and experienced companies are permitted to submit tenders.
- Prequalification is categorised into levels relating to the complexity and value of the project.

Preferred Supply Arrangements (PSA)

- PSAs allow the Department to issue works to a list of suppliers with the required qualifications and experience to perform routine, low risk projects
- PSA Members must pre-agree the terms and conditions for their particular category of work, enabling a faster contracting process.















